This was a very attractive and well presented plant grown by Ralph. Both parents were known as



Dockrillia and all that group have been moved back to Dendrobium. Looking up the plant on Orchidwiz it was a named cross, Dendrobium Edric, with one photo and awarded in South Australia ACC/AOC 77.3 Points, 2008. The plant Ralph has grown has thick leaves and compact whereas the one in the picture had thin leaves. D wassellii Plants are found only in the McIlwraith Range on the Cape York Peninsula. They grow at the edge of Araucaria vine forests in areas with good light and strong air movement at about 1000 ft. (300 m). D linguiforme is Commonly epiphytic on tree trunks. Australia and New Caledonia. In Australia, distribution extends along the east coast from near Narooma in southeastern New South Wales northward to near Cooktown in Queensland. Although plants usually grow near the coast, they have been found as far as 155 mi. (250 km) inland near Coolah, New South Wales. The habitat is extremely varied. Plants may grow on rocks in full sun, in open forest, or on trees in the dense shade of rainforests. They grow from near sea level to at least 3600 ft. (0-1100 m). In

the more northerly (warmer) locations, they are usually found in the highlands. From Orchidwiz

This was a beautifully grown plant by Guy well deserving the Specie and Specimen and an alba form. It is one you don't see too often and grown to perfection. These are a cool growers and easy to cultivate. It comes from Northeast India. northern Thailand, Laos, Cambodia, Vietnam, southwest China. In India, plants are found in the Khasia Hills and Manipur. In Thailand, plants are found in the northwest mountains of on Doi Inthanond and Doi Suthep. In Vietnam, plants have been found near Dalat, and they are said to be common from Finnom to Bao Lac. In China. plants grow on trees and rocks in forests at 1650-5750 ft. (500-1750 m) in the provinces of Yunnan, Tibet, Guangxi, Guangdong, and Jiangxi. from Orchidwiz. Coming from such a range there are many forms of this species and it is amazing how far spread some can be.

# Novice plant of the Month: Bulbophyllum (Bulb.) Elizabeth Ann 'Buckleberry' Grown by: Michael & Sheree Howard

This is a beautiful Bulbophyllum grown by the Howards. They are not hard to grow and when grown into a large plant can be quite attractive. There are a number of bulbos with this type of



flower. This one is a hybrid of [Bulb.] longissimum x [Bulb.] rothschildianum and both these species are common in collections also all cool growing. I have grown them in baskets and shallow dishes and have done ok. The tips of each flower are very

long and hard to see in the photo but you can see right to the bottom of picture. One specie comes from Thailand the other from northern India.
