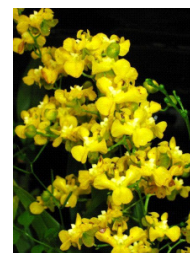
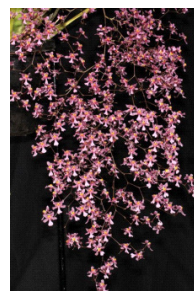
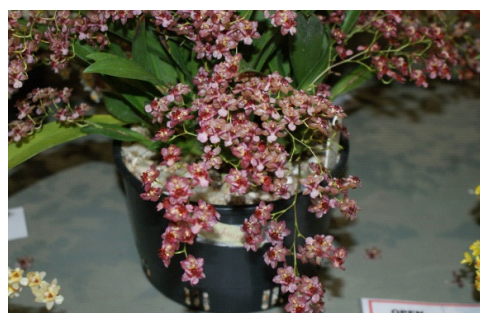

Show Marshal Report For July 2017

Hybrid of the Month : Oncidium [Onc.] Twinkle 'Red Fantasy'

Grown by: Gloria & Allan Cushway

Twinkle is a very popular orchid, with color forms from white thru yellows to dark reds, and flowers, even though a small flower, do vary. This one is a quite a good one and there were a few



shown. It is a primary hybrid between Oncidium [Onc.] cheiroporum and Oncidium [Onc.] sotoanum (syn Oncidium ornithorhyncum) which it was

known by and is an easy one to grow and are available from vendors at the St Ives show. I have grown them in both bark mixes and coconut fibre. They can flower on a very small plant like a tube size. [Onc.] cheiroporum comes from *Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, and Colombia.* In Nicaragua, plants have been found growing as epiphytes in wet montane forests near Matagalpa at 3600 ft. (1100 m). In Costa Rica, plants grow on larger branches of trees in montane and premontane forests at 3300-6550 ft. (1000-2000 m). In Panama, plants have been found in Coclé Province in El Valle de Antón at 1650-3300 ft. (500-1000 m) and at several locations in Chiriquí Province at 4250-6550 ft. (1300-2000 m). from *Orchidwiz*
 Oncidium [Onc.] sotoanum (syn Oncidium ornithorhyncum) *This is a northern Central American, cool to warm growing species that grows as an epiphyte in humid forests at altitudes up to 1500 meters and likes a semi-winter rest. Found as a medium sized, epiphytic plant with*

oval, compressed, 2 1/2" [6 cm] pseudobulbs that are fairly closely grouped on the rhizome and as a rule there are two apical, flexible, curved, linear-lanceolate, 8" [20 cm] leaves. The basal, curving or pendulous, to 2' [60 cm] long, dense and branched, strongly arched panicle, sometimes two to a mature pseudobulb, arise in the fall and winter and have numerous fragrant longlasting flowers.

Specie Plant of the Month : Encyclia [E.] osmantha (syn. Epidendrum osmanthum) Grownby:Cary Polis

This specie comes from Southeastern Brazil. Plants are found in the state of Minas Gerais near Itutinga at about 2800 ft. (850 m).from Orchidwiz and is a cool grower and have found Encyclia an easy specie to grow. Cary's plant was well



flowered and displayed itself very well. This is quite a large group with some moved into other groups and there are quite a number of hybrids available, which are

seen at times. I find they are quite a hardy plant after I moved they were growing in full sun and still are and they have grown quite well. There are the odd one that care is needed. Check out where it comes from and then look at that condition this applies to most when that spot is found that works keep it there.

Specimen Plant of the Month : Dendrochilum [Ddc.] tenellum Grown by Angie Sulfaro



This Dendrochilum is an interesting orchid, looks like grass when not in flower and then gets the spikes from near the top of the leaves. This orchid comes from the Philippines. A common and widely distributed orchid, it grows in mountainous areas at 3300-4900 ft. (1000-1500 m). Plants are reported from the following islands Babuyan, Camiguin, Leyte, Luzon, and Mindanao, Mindoro. On Luzon, they are found in the provinces of Bataan, Benguet, Mountain Province (near Bontoc), Cagayan, Camarines Sur, Ifugao,

Kalinga-Apayao, Laguna, Nueva Vizcaya, Rizal, Sorsogon, and Zambales. On Mindanao they are found in Davao Province From Orchidwiz,as above they have a wide distribution and a cool grower at that height. As they fill a pot, pot on to a slightly larger pot and will grow to this one in size.

Novice Plant of the Month: Rhyncattleanthe [Rth.] Young-Min Orange x Golden Satisfaction Grown by: Mark Ashbury

Mark has an orchid with a nice orange colour. The flowers were not displayed to perfection, but was attractive. The Goldern Satisfaction does not



appear to be a registered hybrid but this

happens till it gets registered by someone. The Rth. Young-Min Orange has 12 species in its back ground and can see where it gets its colour and also what is in the other parent has made this orchid. It will be interesting to see it again and how many flowers it could produce. Gur. aurantiaca (43.8%) is the greatest part of the 1st parent , this shows where this plant gets its colour.
